**Mail to the Director of Operations
by January 1 of current Convention year**

H. A husband, wife, cohabitant, or family member of a professional trainer who solicits, advertises whether it be in magazines, newspaper, handout, Websites, on vehicles and/or trailers or any other means of communication to the public, who trains equine in/for any other equine association (this would include donkeys and zebras) may not hold an amateur card in the ASPC/AMHR/ASPR nor can they show as an amateur in any sanctioned ASPC/AMHR/ASPR show. For the purposes of this rule, the term cohabitant is defined as any individuals living together in a relationship, as would a married couple, but not legally married.
