

**Novice Amateur-a person qualified as an amateur according to the rules specified in this rulebook pertaining to amateur qualifications and specifications shall be eligible to apply for novice amateur status and show in novice amateur classes.**

**Eligibility for Novice Amateur Eligibility**

**Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments a person is a Novice Amateur for all approved Novice Amateur classes at all shows conducted under the ASPC/AMHR/ASPR rules who after his/her 18<sup>th</sup> birthday meets all qualifications and requirements of Amateur status including section 3.1A through I of Section III and who also qualifies under the following sub sections of Section 3.2 A through I:**

**A. Who have never shown in ASPC/AMHR/ASPR approved shows OR**

**B. Have competed in ASPC/AMHR/ASPR approved amateur, open or stakes classes less than 2 full show years prior to the show year enacting the Novice Amateur Program. This 2 show year rule does not disqualify a person from qualifying as a Novice Amateur for approved Novice Amateur classes if they have not shown in corresponding Amateur, Open or Stakes classes as are offered as Novice Amateur classes according to this Novice Amateur Program.**

**C. Who have not earned more than 30 points per class as calculated in 3.2 G below in Novice Amateur, Amateur, Open, Stakes or Halter championship classes in ASPC/AMHR/ASPR approved shows. The earning of 30 points in one class does not eliminate eligibility for Novice Amateur status in other Novice Amateur classes in which 30 points or more were not earned in that/those Novice classes or corresponding Amateur, Open, Stakes or Halter Championship classes. However earning 30 points or more in a driving class does eliminate Novice eligibility for the other Novice Amateur driving classes.**

D. Who have never won an AMHR National championship or an ASPC/ASPR Congress Championship in a class corresponding to the now offered Novice Amateur class(es). Winning a National Championship/Congress Championship in driving classes in Amateur, Open or Stake/Championship classes disqualifies a person from competing in that/those driving classes as a Novice Amateur, likewise earning a National/Congress championship in any corresponding Novice Amateur, Amateur, Open or Halter Championship or Grand Championship disqualifies a person from competing in those Novice Amateur corresponding classes.

E. Youth who become eligible for amateur status due to age are eligible to compete in Novice Amateur approved classes only if their points accumulated during their age 13-17 competition years in Youth, Open or Stakes/Championship classes do not exceed 30 points during the period prior to their exceeding the youth age requirements OR who have not shown as a youth for 2 complete show years the 2 years prior to the inception of the Novice Amateur Program AND who have not won an AMHR National Championship/Congress Championship in any Youth, Open or Stakes/Championship class(es) corresponding to the Novice Amateur class(es). Such youth may be eligible for Novice Amateur classes in which they have not earned 30 points or more in a youth class corresponding to Novice Amateur classes or have not earned a National/Congress Championship in like classes and the 2 year rule will also apply. The same restriction in D above relative driving classes applies to youth.

F. As long as a Novice Amateur is eligible to compete in Novice Amateur classes, cross entering of Novice Amateurs into like Amateur classes at any local, National or Congress show is NOT permitted during any show year EXCEPT when the Novice class is not offered. The Novice Amateur will lose their Novice status for this/those classes if this occurs when this/these Novice class(es) are offered.

G. Placings or points for each exhibitor for all classes will be calculated by local show managers and the information required by the national office will then be forwarded to the National office who will then maintain a total tabulation of points for each exhibitor per class and this will determine the point eligibility of exhibitors for the Novice Amateur Program. Members are encouraged to maintain their own record of points in the event of a dispute. Points will be calculated and assigned in the same manner as the current HOF system, however HOF status is not grant to exhibitors.

H. AMHR National championship or Congress shows-Members competing at local shows in Novice Amateur approved classes who attain 30 or more points in a given Novice class(es) during any given show year may continue to show in that/those Novice class(es) for that show year and at that year's National championship or Congress show in those same classes.

I. Novice amateur eligible members may compete in Open and Stakes/Championship classes as well as any classes not offered as Novice Amateur classes, however points earned in corresponding Amateur, Open or Stakes/Championship classes WILL count against the 30 points limit for Novice eligibility. Novice driving classes constitute eligibility to compete in their respective Stakes classes.

3.1 Eligibility - Regardless of one's equestrian skills and/or accomplishments, a person is an amateur for all shows conducted under the ASPC/AMHR/ASPR rules who after his/her 18th birthday has not engaged in any of the following activities, which would make him/her a professional. ← this section remains the same as written.

- a. Accepts remuneration AND rides, exercises, drives, shows, trains, assists in training, schools or conducts clinics or seminars.
- b. Accepts remuneration AND gives riding or driving lessons, showmanship lessons, equitation lessons, trains horses, or provides consultation services in riding, driving, showmanship, equitation, or training of horses.
- c. Accepts remuneration AND acts as an employee in a position such as a groom, farrier, bookkeeper, veterinarian or barn manager AND instructs, rides, drives, shows, trains or schools horses that are owned, boarded or trained by his employer, any member of his employer's family, or a business in which his employer has an ownership interest.
- d. Accepts remuneration AND uses his name, photograph or other form of personal association as a horseperson in connection with any advertisement or product/service for sale, including but not limited to apparel, equipment or property.
- e. Accepts prize money in equitation or showmanship.
- f. Rides, drives or shows any horse that a cohabitant or family member or a cohabitant or family member's business receives remuneration for boarding, training, riding, driving or showing. A cohabitant or family member of a trainer may not absolve themselves of this rule by entering into a lease or any other agreement for a horse owned by a client of the trainer. For the purposes of this rule, the term cohabitant is defined as any individuals living together in a relationship, as would a married couple, but not legally married.
- g. Gives instruction to any person or rides, drives, or shows any horse, for which activity his cohabitant or another person in his family or business in which his cohabitant or a family member controls will receive remuneration for the activity. A cohabitant or family member of a trainer may not absolve themselves of this rule by entering into a lease or any other agreement for a horse owned by a client of the trainer.
- h. Accepts remuneration AND acts as an agent in the sale of a horse or pony or accepts a horse or pony on consignment for the purpose of sale or training that is not owned by him, his cohabitant, or a member of his family, a farm/ranch/syndicate/partnership/corporation/business in which he, his cohabitant or a member of his family controls.
- i. Advertises one's equestrian services such as training or instruction.
- j. Accepts remuneration AND acts as an intern, apprentice, or working student whose responsibilities include, but are not limited to, riding, driving, showmanship, handling, showing, training or assisting in training, giving lessons/coaching and/or schooling horses other than horses actually owned by him.
- k. Accepts remuneration in excess of rental fee for use of a facility, ring or school horses.
- l. Accepts remuneration for such use AND uses commercial logoed items while on competition grounds unless expressly permitted by applicable division rules.

To be **judged 75% on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture and overall appearance of the driver and 25% on the condition of the harness and vehicle and the neatness of attire.**

In order to evaluate a driver's versatility, the judge may require a test.

3. Drive a figure eight.

An entry must show strong definition in all required gates.**

**Delete:** Breeching optional

**Add:** Breeching is required.

**Proposed Rule Change:**

“Side checks optional. Breeching is required. Tying down of tongues is prohibited. Bridles should fit snugly to prevent catching on the vehicle or other pieces of harness. A throatlatch and a noseband or cavesson is mandatory. Open bridles are permitted, but are not encouraged.”

**Justification:**

Breeching should be required for all vehicles for safety reasons. Breeching is the breaking mechanism for most carriage vehicles. It is for the safety of the ponies and exhibitors to add this rule change.
