Proposed Rule Changes Due January 1st of the Current Convention Year

Proposed Rule Changes to be brought before the National Convention must be sent to the Director of Operations to send to the Rules Committee who will review the submissions for duplication, clarity and conflict with existing rules.

All submissions must be postmarked on or before January 1 of the current Convention year. All items **MUST BE** submitted on the following proposal form. All copies **MUST** be in type format, signed and **MUST** include the submitter's ASPC/AMHR membership number.

Proposed Rule Change (provide desired language and intent of rule):

There will be a minimum of 4 fences and a maximum of 8 fences.

There will be a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 8 jumping efforts

(with the in and out labeled A & B and is one jumping effort).

Reason/Justification for Rule Change (provide brief description)

Increasing to 8 jumps allows for an in & out to be set and used with 7
additional jumps. There are many times (particularly at Nationals) where a rail
is knocked down and the ring crew has to scramble to get it reset to be jumped again.

Continued: Adding the extra jumps alleviates this problem. In addition when the in/out is numbered as two different numbers, it confuses the exhibitors whether to re-jump both jumps. Example, if the jump is labelled one and two and the horse refuses #2, they must retake both one and two which is jumping number #1 twice and would normally be considered off course. Labeling the in and out 1A and 1B in the example above brings the labelling in line with all other breed rules and ensures the exhibitors know that the jump is an in & out.
