“Foundation Shetlands shall be the result of mating of Division A to a Division A for four generations. All Foundation will be required to acquire pedigree verification from the American Shetland Pony Club, those Registration 78 Section IV – Registration Rules accepted shall be issued a “gold seal” on their Registration paperwork.”

“ The Foundation entry will be required to provide show management with proof of pedigree verification from ASPC (Registration certificate must include Foundation certification).”

Reason/Justification for rule change:

The Foundation division is promoted and taught to judges and exhibitors as a type, not a bloodline. The current rulebook has a clear definition on the type of pony that should be showing in the foundation division.

Currently, if a pony has a foundation seal but is more “classic” type, it can show in the classic division instead. If a pony does not have a seal but fits foundation type, it has nowhere to successfully show.

With the current wording, all ponies will eventually be able to show in the foundation division if a seal is requested through the office (after 4 generations of ponies without a “B”).

Extraordinary –

We are requesting this to be extraordinary because the current rule is limiting the amount of ponies that can be entered in the foundation division and is therefore a loss of funds to the registry.
